Through our discussions and activities, students will understand how to keep their bodies safe, as well as how to demonstrate internet safety. Due to the sensitive nature of these topics, we encourage you to engage in continued exploration of the concepts at home. After the lesson, ask your student about what personal safety means and what strategies they can use to keep safe. 





Nurse's News

The health suite is still in need of gently used clothing. All sizes will be accepted.

Hearing & Vision Screening - Hearing and Vision screening will be held at Lyons Mill from January 8th to January 17th. All students in kindergarten, first, and fourth grade will be screened. In addition, any students new to Baltimore County Public Schools in grades second, third, and fifth will be screened. If you have any questions about the screening, please do not hesitate to contact Nurse Limmer at 443-809-6758.

When should I keep my child home? - The cold weather is here, and the flu season is coming. The question always arises when to keep your child home from school? Children who have the following symptoms should stay home and not come to school until these symptoms have been gone for at least 24 hours without the help of medication. The doctor must send a note that states the condition is not contagious and that it is OK for your child to come back to school.

FEVER – **If a fever over 100 degrees is present, please do not send him or her to school.** It doesn't help your child's health to give medicine for fever and send him/her to school...that only reduces the fever for a short time and doesn't take care of the illness that is causing the fever. Children must be fever-free for 24 hours, without the use of medicine, before returning to school.

VOMITING/DIARRHEA – Until we know that these are no signs of a contagious illness, such as a stomach virus, your child should be kept home. If the vomiting or diarrhea happen more than once that day, or if they are associated with fever, you must keep your child home.

SKIN RASHES - If the rash has any fluid or pus coming from it, the child must remain out of school until the rash has been treated. A note from the doctor should be sent stating it is ok to return to school. If the rash is gone, dried, or scabbed over with no new spots appearing, students may also return. Anytime a rash is associated with fever, the child may not come to school until that fever is gone for 24 hours without medication.

RED EYES, ESPECIALLY IF THERE IS ALSO DRAINAGE OR CRUSTING AROUND THE EYE - This can often mean your child has *conjunctivitis*, also known as **pink-eye**. Not all pink-eye is contagious. Sometimes it is just allergies or other irritations that are causing the red color. Until we know for sure, which means we must have a note from the doctor stating the condition is not contagious, or until the redness and drainage are completely gone, students must stay at home.

Wellness Policy for Schools

Policy 5470: Wellness This policy establishes standards for all foods and beverages such as those provided at classroom parties, school celebrations and as rewards and incentives. For example, all foods and beverages used in classroom celebrations will meet the same nutrition standards that are used for sale in the school meals program (competitive foods and beverages).

Spanish Passport Program

We have been having so much fun in Spanish class! I hope that you've been enjoying seeing your child's progress in Spanish from all the graded papers that have come home each week. If you have not seen any graded papers, please let me



know and ask your child. As a reminder, these grades are to help you and your child gauge their progress in Spanish class. There will not be a report card grade, but your child will receive 2 Spanish progress report cards (2nd quarter and 4th quarter). In addition to our classroom lessons, your child has been learning more Spanish in Middlebury on GOOGLE CHROME through BCPS One in Schoology. Your child can also access Middlebury at home the same way we do in school. There are a lot of ways you can help your child at home to prepare him or her to be as successful as possible throughout the year and even into next year.

- * Ask each week (on their Spanish class day) ask what they learned in class & look on **Schoology**.
- * Ask what they are working on in **Middlebury** and ask them to show you in Schoology. (It's self-paced.)
- * Get some Spanish books out of the library and have them find words they know and/or recognize.
- * Remind your child to ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE in class at all times. (This includes repeating the

words/phrases, acting out the vocabulary, staying focused, and following directions.)

Bringing Literacy Home Tips to Help Your Child with Reading at Home.

Explaining F&P Levels

Have you ever wondered which level books are

appropriate for your student? All students in grades 1 - 5 are informally assessed using the Fountas & Pinnell (F&P) Benchmark Assessment System. This is an informal assessment that allows teachers to determine students' instructional and independent reading level. Teachers use the data from this assessment to help determine student's reading needs and to make reading groups, but parents can use this information as well! When helping your child pick out books at the library or the bookstore, look for titles that are on their **instructional** or **independent** level. If it's a book on their instructional level, you can read it with them, asking

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6^{th} grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 schooldays, and Student C will have read for 3.

questions and monitoring their understanding as they read. Books at a student's independent level or lower can be read independently. Check out this Scholastic website for some examples of books on your child's reading level: https://tinyurl.com/booksbylevel

Questions to ask your student while reading:

- *What do you think will happen next?
- *Why do you think _____ did that?
- *What does that make you wonder? Is this making sense to you?

Questions to ask your student after reading:

- *Can you retell me what happened in the story in your own words?
- *What were the most important events in the story?
- *What was the main message or lesson in this book?
- *Did you think this was a good ending? Why or why not?
