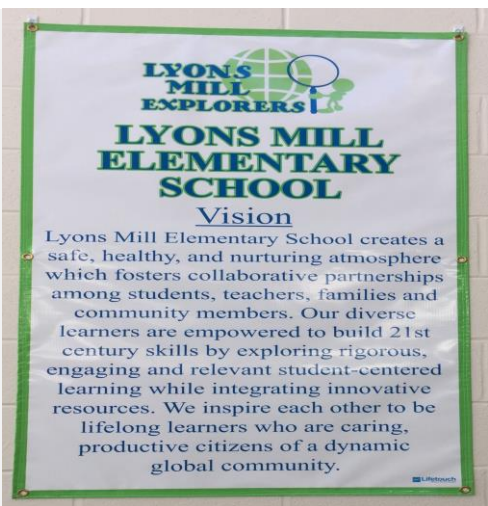

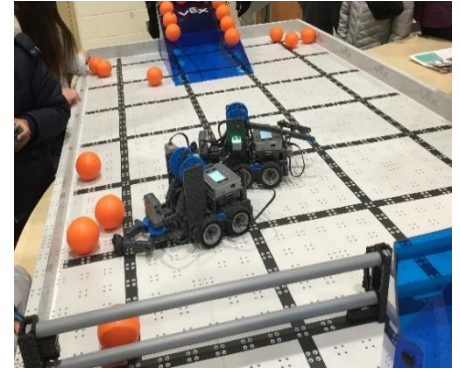

## STEM Fair 2016 Excitement

Lyons Mill Elementary started 2016 with the excitement of preparing for our very first STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) Fair. Lyons Mill Elementary's mission makes sure that students are "empowered to achieve in literacy, math, engineering, and science." By embracing this culture, ALL students from grades Kindergarten to Grade 5 participate in our STEM Fair.

On Wednesday, January 21, 2016, Lyons Mill opened its doors to judges, families, and community members. Over 200 families explored the building viewing STEM projects presented by every grade level. Meanwhile, the school gymnasium was filled with various clubs and community members promoting STEM. Visitors could explore and learn more about our school's 3D printers, SLIME Club, and VEX Robotics. Exhibition tables featuring games from Marbles The Brain Store and the opportunity to learn about light and color were very popular. A special thank you to our parent Ms. Littlejohn who sponsored the Biochemists from Fort Meade - LTC Matthew Moser, PhD and CPT Robert Nadeau, PhD.



At the end of the evening, all visitors returned to the gymnasium to hear the surprise announcement of our very first 4th and 5th grade STEM Fair winners.

- Congratulations to fourth grade student, Yashwanth Santhosh Kumar, who won first place for his project which explored how wind speed affects the number of spins of an anemometer and its measurement.
- Congratulations to fifth grade student, Chandler Elias, who won for her project which explored how the level of turbidity would affect the amount of dissolved oxygen in water.

Both students will represent Lyons Mill Elementary during Baltimore County Public Schools Elementary STEM Fair scheduled for Friday, May 13th and Saturday, May 14th at Parkville High School. It was an exciting evening for Lyons Mill Elementary! Mr. Travis Russell, coordinator of our LMES STEM Fair as well as a fifth grade teacher, wrapped up the evening by saying, "Thank you to everyone for making our first annual STEM Fair a big success. ### Spanish News for Grade 4 Families



**¡Hola!** Me llamo Señorita Chupnick, y soy la maestra de español en Lyons Mill Elementary. We continue to have mini conversations in Spanish each class using our new vocabulary and questioning that we learn. We learned various activities that kids like to do, and then we asked each other about which activity we like to do. The following week, we learned how to ask about two specific activities and which

one we like more (\_\_\_ or \_\_\_). We also learned how to talk about which activities our family members like to do. After that, we learned about sports—always a fun topic of discussion. We learned how to ask and answer about which one is our favorite sport. As 2016 began, we delved into the weather. We discuss the weather at the beginning of each class so now we can actually carry on a mini conversation about the weather. We then continued the rest of January discussing which activities and/or sports we do during certain weather and also during each season. We also started to work in small groups for some of our lessons and students became more independent in their learning. At this halfway point, students should be able to have conversations in Spanish. The sentence structure is a bit basic, but they now have a plethora of topics about which to talk.

### Parent Information Middlebury Program

- **PARENTS:** The Spanish online Middlebury program, which is a supplement to the in-person lessons, can be accessed at home 24/7 through **GOOGLE CHROME**. All you need to do is go to BCPS One. Your child will use his/her BCPS One username and password to access the program.
- Please remind your child to check his/her BCPS One e-mail account for important messages from Srta. Chupnick regarding his/her projects and/or re-doing work. Students may not move on to Unit 5 or Unit 9 until they have received an e-mail telling them that they can. If there are missing assessments and/or grades of less than 80%, students must redo them before moving forward. The e-mails are very specific and user friendly.
- Students must go IN ORDER through the program and cannot skip around on Middlebury. After every 4 units, your child will work on a “mission” (part of a year-long project). These “missions” incorporate all the learning that we’ve done in class and on Middlebury so that your child can apply what he/she learned. All instructions and samples for Mission 1 are on the Middlebury program under Unit 4, and Mission 2 is under Unit 8. Please don’t complete anything *FOR* your child, but feel free to work *WITH* your child. It is NOT an obligation at all to do Spanish at home. Time is given in school daily & weekly to complete everything. It is self-paced, so your child will acquire and apply the new Spanish knowledge at his/her own pace.
- I am looking forward to our next adventures in Spanish class (las aventuras en la clase de español) as we continue learning at Lyons Mill!

## Attendance Procedures



Upon entering and exiting the bus lobby or car loop lobby, students in Kindergarten through Grade 3 are expected to use their key fob to record their arrival and dismissal. ScholarChip kiosks will record arrival/dismissal attendance data. Students in Grades 4 - 5 "tap in" using their BCPS One Card in the classroom.

## School Hours

- School hours 8:30 a.m.- 3:30 p.m. (Students may enter the building at 8:30 a.m.)
- Arrival 8:30 a.m. to 8:45 a.m.
- There is no supervision for any child dropped off before 8:30 a.m. Unsupervised students are not permitted on school grounds prior to 8:30 a.m. Students must arrive in their classrooms before the 8:45 a.m. bell.
- Homeroom begins at 8:45 a.m.
- Dismissal 3:15 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

## Office Hours

- Office hours 8:15 a.m.- 4:15 p.m.
- Student contact information forms for your child must be updated. This information is provided to classroom teachers and is used by our main office.
- If your child arrives to school late or leaves school early for any reason, please report to the main office. Parents are required to sign students in/out in the main office.
- If your child forgets materials necessary for the school day, these should be dropped off in the office. Please make sure items are clearly marked with your child's name.
